PEACH OLD-FASHIONED -

Cedar Ridge Bourbon, Peach Nectar, Peach Schnapps, Lemon Juice, Orange Bitters

In 1806, in response to the question "What is a cocktail?" a New York newspaper editor replied "a stimulating liquor, composed of spirits, sugar, water and bitters." Today that is the blueprint for what we call an "old fashioned."



HIATT 150 ——

Revelton Honey Whiskey, Iowa Distilling Prairie Fire Cinnamon Whiskey, Apple Cider, Lemon Juice

The original Red Delicious Apple tree was discovered in Madison County on the farm of Jess Hiatt in 1872, this year marks the 150th anniversary of this delicious treat!



ROSEMAN SUNSET -

Cedar Ridge Dark Rum, Cranberry Juice, Apple Cider

Roseman Bridge is one of 6 remaining covered bridges in Madison County, and featured in the movie The Bridges of Madison County. This drink reminds us of the simple beauty of a sunset over this iconic bridge.



PB NIGHTCAP -

Revelton Whiskey Cream, Skrewball Peanut Butter Whiskey, Kamora Coffee Liqueur

This cocktail is a nod to George Washington Carver, who lived in Winterset from 1888 - 1890. Carver later developed 300 uses for the peanut.



MULBERRY MULE -----

Revelton Mulberry Gin, Ginger Beer, Lime Juice

Sipping this drink may evoke childhood memories of plucking the sweet & juicy fruit from mulberry trees (which still are commonly found throughout Madison County).



THE POLLIINATOR -

Revelton American Gin, Honey-Sage Simple Syrup, Lemon Juice

Once covered in native grasses and flowers, Madison County is now hometo prairie reconstruction - and lots of very happy pollinating, honey-making bees.



THE MADISON AVENUE ——

Templeton Rye, Carpano Antica Formula Vermouth, Orange Bitters

Our take on the Manhattan - the most popular drink in the late 19th century and rumored to have been created the same year as the home of the Drift: 1874.



PEACE, LOVE, AGAVE ----

El Jimador Tequila, Mezcal, Grapefruit Juice, Lime Juice, Maple Syrup, Soda Water

Our take on a Paloma has a subtle smokiness that comes from the charred barrels in which the Mezcal is aged. Savor the drink, this moment, and the peaceful beauty that surrounds us.



THE DEVIL'S WASHBOARD -

El Jimador Tequila, Gran Gala Orange Liqueur, Lime Juice, Habanero Simple Syrup
